Rainious Oliver Russell, a resident of the Sheridan community for the past 13 years ded suddenly at his home at about 3:00 o'clock Saturday morning, August 6, as a result of a heart attack. Funeral services were held Monday, August 8, at 10:00 A. M. at the Christian church with Rev. Conley D. Silsby in charge. Burial was at Shelborn, Ore.

Mr. Russell, son of Mr. and Mrs. A. P. Russell, was born at Sutter, Calif., February 26, 1876, and was 62 years, five months and 10 days old at the time of his death.
